Coin Toss Challenge by The Magician

Well after weeks of having to watch night after night of the Big Bash, the rugby league is back.

The 2023 NRL Pre-season Challenge has us licking our lips with anticipation. For years people have professed that trials should bewell ... Trials. And that rugby league is a simple game.

Well this is 2023 my friends and there is a Pre-season Challenge to win.

Now it is important we all understand the rules for this two-week competition. Now everyone concentrate. Yes, even you Punters Pal.

Firstly, even though there are 17 teams in the NRL comp, there are 18 teams in the Challenge. St Helens is coming over for the World Club Challenge which is not to be confused with the Preseason Challenge though they are playing both ... at the same time.

Now before there are any arguments each game goes for 80 minutes, there is no golden point, except if you are playing the World Club Challenge where there is golden point.

Each team has a squad of 28 players in week one and 26 players in week two, and there are unlimited interchanges. However, if you are playing the World Club Challenge that match is limited to game-day squads of 17 and interchanges capped at 10. For the Dolphins I assume anyone who lives on the Peninsula will pretty much be given an opportunity for a run.

Now we get to the points. Oh the points. If a team wins they get 12 points. Why 12 points for a win? Why not 50? How about 1000? Sounds like someone was binge watching 'Whose Line Is It Anyway?' over the summer break.

But that is not all ... there are bonus points if any team scores 5+ tries, 5+ line breaks, 10+ offloads or if the Great Man, Mr Fivestar is able to land a 5-leg multi.

Importantly, as it is highly likely there will be more than one team on the same points after the two rounds the NRL has detailed a substantial list of tiebreakers.

And you guessed it ... if all else fails the winner will be decided by the toss of a coin. There is something very Australian having the \$100,000 winner's cheque determined by a coin toss.

Feature Race this week is the CF Orr Stakes.

From 1993 onwards it has been classified as a Group 1 and the honour roll is littered with multiple Group 1 champions such as Rising Fast, Tobin Bronze, Manikato (3 x winner), At Talaq, Vo Rogue (another 3 x winner), Jeune, Saintly and Black Caviar.

It was once considered one of the form races for the year as the trick was to blackbook all the starters. Last year's runners included Cascadian which went on to win the Peter Young Stakes, All Aged, Hill Stakes and Craven Plate; Lighthouse (Coolmore), Sierra Sue (Futurity) and I'm Thunderstruck (Makybe Diva).

The winner is likely to come from the top 3 in the betting. From the inside barrier Tuvalu will set the pace. The long straight should benefit both I'm Thunderstruck and Jacquinot as both will get back and run on. Putting Jacquinot on top as it drops 4kg from its last start win at Sandown and if it reproduces the sectionals from its first up run will be hard to beat.
