Q&A with Stephanie Thornton

Stephanie Thornton and Ben Thompson are currently the golden couple of Queensland racing. Last Saturday Ben rode five winners at Doomben as well as recently winning the Oakleigh Plate on Uncommon James. This week we caught up with Stephanie.



Is it true you left school during your final year to pursue a career in racing?

I did. I had always wanted to complete yr12, but unfortunately there weren't quite enough hours in the day to fit it all in. I knew where I wanted my career to go and so all my focus turned to racing.

Were you that kid in class, like me, who had the form guide in the middle of the maths text book?

Not quite, but I did have my phone hiding behind a book with racing.com on to watch Dad's horses or my brothers ride! You could say my focus wasn't always entirely on school work.

Is there a friendly rivalry between you and your siblings?

Absolutely. We love to beat each other especially in a close finish. We are probably more competitive with each other than anyone else, but I'm saying that we are also each other's biggest supporters. And if I can't win I love to see them win and vice versa.

Clearly, you did the hard yards before your now husband Ben joined you in Queensland. What was it like moving to Queensland and forging a pathway?

My brother Boris actually moved to Queensland before me, so he set the plans in motion. We followed his lead. I believe everyone makes their own path however and everyone's career is different, we can't compare our journeys to each other because we are all so independent. Queensland has been a great move for almost my entire family now, my parents, my brother Boris and my husband Ben, we absolutely love it here and wouldn't change it for the world.

What do you look at when studying form for a race?

There a many things you look at when studying the form. The grade and distance of the race and what your horse has previously been running in. The horses settling position and how and when they have run their best races. Of course the opposition as well. Same things for them as your own horse, class, distance, settling position. What horses you do and don't want to follow.

What movie or TV show do you force your husband to watch with you?

MAFS. Ben is adamant he won't get hooked on it but he ends up more interested than I do!

What is your go to comfort food?

Definitely pasta. It's my favourite food, but obviously being a jockey carbs aren't always your best friend. However when I can I will always be eating pasta!

Do you own any pets and what are their names?

Ben and I would almost say we have a zoo at home.

We have two horses, Dunk & Moses. One dog, Jelly. And four cats, Georgie, Freckles, Richard and Roxy.

Do you have a favourite horse?

I have two. The Odyssey and Gotta Kiss. They both hold very special places in my heart. I had great success on both and loved more than anything when I was in a race on them.

What is one track you would like to ride at and one race you would like to win?

I can't pick a track that I would like to ride on particularly, but if I could win one race it would be the Cox Plate. I love Moonee Valley. It's my favourite racecourse. I had a lot of success there as an apprentice in Melbourne and that would be such a special race to win.

Tell us about a time you have had a great day at the track?

My best day at the track would have been when I won the \$1 million QTIS race on Magic Millions day on The Odyssey. It's the biggest race day in Queensland and to have a winner on that day on one of my favourite horses was so special. I would love to go back and relive that moment over and over again. By far my greatest success on a racetrack!

Over the years Lindsay Park has made this race day their own.

As an example, the Thoroughbred Breeders Stakes was won by David Hayes five times.

But it is the Australian Cup where the stable has a truly remarkable record with 10 winners.



In fact, it wasn't that long ago when Lindsay Park won the race three years in a row with Harlem, winning twice (at \$61 and \$31) and Fifty Stars.

The Australian Cup is a Group 1 WFA race over 2000m at Flemington.
